THE LEGACY

Sree Chaitanya College, Habra occupies a very distinguished position in the higher education map of the district of North 24 Parganas, as well as of the state of West Bengal. The institution overlooking Jessore Road (NH 35), is about 40 km from Kolkata. This college was established in 1956, primarily to cater the need of the thousands of helpless youths who, owing to the partition of India, were forced to settle almost as paupers in this part of the state, but had nourished deep in their hearts an inextinguishable urge to pursue higher education to overcome their miseries. Their dream would have never been realised without the initiative of the Habra Siksha Parishad and the kind patronage of the Government of West Bengal and the legendary Chief Minister, Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy, who encouraged the founding of the college. The project was given proper shape by the youngest minister in the Roy-Cabinet, Tarun Kanti Ghosh, who was also an MLA from Habra. Ghosh patronized the foundation of the College by donating Rupees Fifty Thousand, and he became the first president of the Governing Body of Sree Chaitanya College, Habra (1956-67).

As time rolled on, the college grew into a giant academic institution spreading across a large campus area of 89,030 square metres with Honours departments in Arts and Science subjects. The College has always been blessed with a group of dedicated teachers with brilliant academic careers and a band of committed non-teaching staff, including librarians, and students who have persisted with their dreams of pursuing higher education.

The hard work of the entire college has helped in producing generations of excellent students with excellent academic results, many of who became University toppers. Many of our former students have been very successful in life as school/college/university teachers, researchers in renowned institutions in India and abroad, bureaucrats and technocrats in government services or business corporations, and as journalists, authors, and theatre personalities of repute.

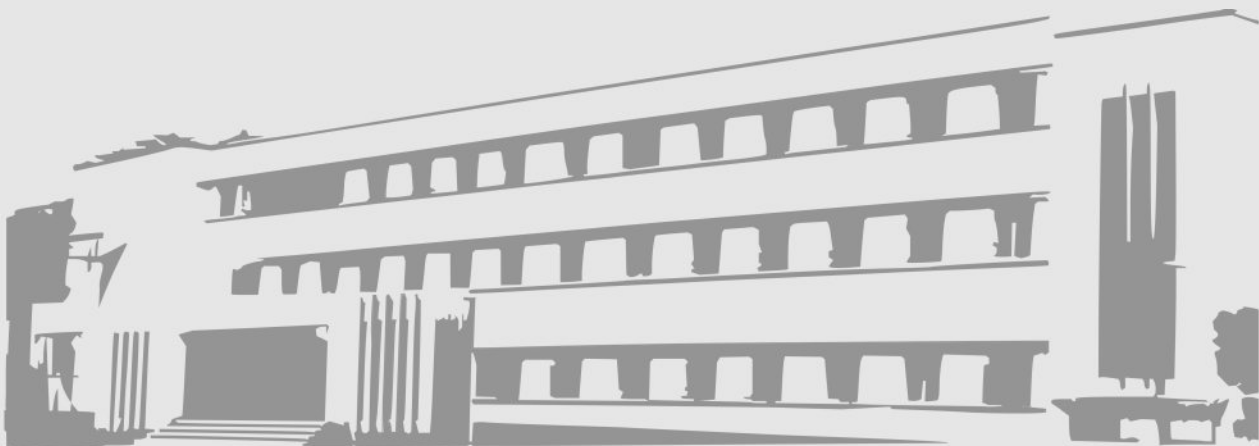

The Teachers' Council maintains a Fund with an objective to provide financial assistance, without any kind of discrimination whatsoever, to students from financially impoverished families who exhibit genuine interest and potentiality in academics.

Remedial classes for academically weak students:

Remedial classes are conducted by most departments to address the difficulties of students in need of additional academic support. Study materials are provided to them to make them exam-ready. The teachers consider this service to be a part of their commitment towards upliftment of students.

Preparing students for competitive exams:

The teachers of our institution are deeply involved in the career of the students. They realise that unless our students fare well in the various job-oriented competitive examinations, their future will remain uncertain. With this mission a MoU has been signed with an organisation imparting professional training to train our students for the competitive examinations at a nominal fee. Regular classes are held on Sundays (10 am to 12 pm) within the college campus. Students mainly from the outgoing batches are inspired to join these classes.

Psychological Counselling:

We appreciate the importance of mental health of our students and staff. Since mental health is closely associated with performance and skill development. Confidentiality is observed in the functioning of the Psychological Counselling Cell. DISTINCTIVE PRIORITY AREA AND THRUST

According to the Vision Statement of the college, and as also highlighted every year in the College Prospectus, the stated aim of the college is: "Character formation through knowledge and value-based education for transformation of the society and the nation." This can be considered as its distinctive priority area and thrust.

In accordance with its Vision Statement, the college provides inclusive education to a large and diverse student population that includes female students in large numbers, as well as first-generation student learners from the SC, ST, and OBC categories.

Ours is a three shift college. The college runs a morning shift, a day shift and an evening shift (which is an extension of the day shift). The college in its entirety is currently governed by the Government Administrator appointed by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, while the Principal serves as the institutional Head.

A strong and functional IQAC is operational. A number of cells and clubs function under the direct control of the IQAC, for example, the Grievance cell, the Anti-Ragging Cell, and the Counselling Cell. A duly formed Internal Complaints Committee is in place to safeguard the interest of the girl students and female staff. A secretary is selected/elected from the teaching staff to function as TCS (Teachers' Council Secretary). For the sake of better administration, two senior teachers serve as morning and evening in-charges of the college.

A number of statutory academic and auxiliary committees ensure smooth running of the institution. Committees like HRMS, PFMS, AISHE, NIRF are formed in accordance with the Government guidelines.

The college has recognition under UGC 2 (f) and 12 (B).

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

High quality education is impossible without adequate infrastructure and learning resources. Sree Chaitanya College, Habra, strives to offer better facilities and opportunities to its students for sustained learning. The campus is situated on a property consisting of 89,030.83 Sq Mt (22 acres) (approx.) of land in which the area of walled campus is 16,349.57 sq.m. (4.04 acres). There are buildings for administration, teaching-learning and a Boys hostel. The campus houses laboratories, library, NCC, Sports room, gymnasium, boys' and girls' common rooms, seminar/conference hall, auditorium, open-air theatre, and canteen.

The policy of the college is to enhance the existing infrastructure and add new amenities to facilitate effective teaching and learning. The college, over the years, has supplemented its existing infrastructure by constructing a PG Building Block, new classrooms, computer labs, and a new Administrative Building (funded by RUSA 2.0).

At present, the college has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching and learning like classrooms, laboratories, library, seminar hall, auditorium, common rooms for students (for boys and girls) and common staffroom for teaching and non-teaching staff.

SUMMARY OF COURSES OFFERED

From 2008, with the foundation of the West Bengal State University (WBSU), the college came under its affiliation with effect from the academic session 2008-09. Now we offer 14 Honours Subject Courses and 17 General Subject Courses according to the NEP (New Education Policy) syllabi framed by WBSU and its respective Boards of Studies (BOS). It is worth mentioning that for last few years, we have also introduced Post Graduate (PG) courses in Bengali, Chemistry and Anthropology. In these courses the College has its own PG-BOS for the respective departments, which frame their own respective syllabus and thus contribute to the development of higher education. Besides regular courses, the college also offers distance education courses both at the UG and PG levels as a unit of Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU).

Currently, all UG admissions are conducted under the Centralized Admission Portal, under the Department of Higher Education, West Bengal. 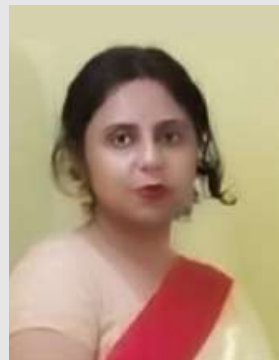
